Subject: Minutes of the Meeting of Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) held on 09.06.2025 for evaluation of technical bid(s) submitted by IIM(s) for assistance in preparation of Concept Paper and Detailed Paper of Proposed Scheme for Digital Address Ecosystem

The Meeting of Technical Evaluation Committee (TEC) (constituted vide letter no. 35-05/2025-PO dated 16.05.2025) was held on 09.06.2025 for evaluation of technical bid(s) submitted by IIM(s) with respect to the RFP Document bearing Tender Reference Number: 35-05/2025-PO and Tender ID: 2025_DOP_858199_1, published on 30.04.2025, for assistance in preparation of Concept Paper and Detailed Paper of Proposed Scheme for Digital Address Ecosystem.

- 2. The following Members of Tender Evaluation Committee (TEC) attended the meeting:

- 3. ADG (DAC) gave a brief background about the proposals submitted by the IIM(s) as under:
 - (i) Earlier, the Bid Opening Committee opened the technical bid on the CPP Portal on 02.06.2025 and found that, out of 7 eligible IIMs, one (01) bidder i.e. IIM Bangalore had participated in this bid.
 - (ii) Further, the Technical Proposal Presentation was held on 05.06.2025 for conducting a detailed presentation by the Indian Institutes of Management (IIMs) on the proposal submitted by the IIMs. Representatives of IIM, Bangalore made a detailed presentation covering all the relevant aspects of the Project, detailed work plan, profiles and work experience of the proposed Key Experts.
 - (iii) The Committee reviewed the proposal and the presentation made by IIM Bangalore and observations as under:
 - (a) There is a mention of the Global Centre of Excellence on Digital Public Goods (CDPG) working under IIM Bangalore, in the proposal submitted by IIM Bangalore. A clarification regarding detailed status of its formation along with background information may be required.

(b) Para 2 of Form T-3: Consultant's Organisation and Experience, of the proposal submitted by IIM Bangalore includes a list of similar assignments completed over the past 10 years. However, this list could not provide the list of such detailed project reports, research papers, or impact assessments related to projects or schemes of Central Ministries/Departments/Statutory or Constitutional Bodies. A clarification may be required in this regard.

A detailed clarification on the above was sought by the Committee.

- 4. In this regard, the requisite clarifications were submitted by IIM Bangalore vide email dated 06.06.2025 wherein Minutes of the Board of Governors for setting up the CDPG and list of selected consulting and sponsored projects awarded to IIM Bangalore by Central Ministries/Departments/Statutory Body/Constitutional Body was conveyed.
- The Committee reviewed the Minutes of the Board of Governors for setting up the CDPG and list of selected consulting and sponsored projects awarded to IIM Bangalore by Central Ministries/Departments/Statutory Body/Constitutional Body submitted by IIM Bangalore, and found that the Global Centre of Excellence on Digital Public Goods (CDPG) at IIM Bangalore, already set up in partnership with iSPIRT, is a dedicated Centre which serves as a hub for research, documentation, and thought leadership on Digital Public Infrastructures (DPIs). Also, The Committee analysed the list of detailed project reports, research papers, or impact assessments related to projects or schemes of Central Ministries/Departments/Statutory or Constitutional Bodies as mentioned at para 2 of Form T-3: Consultant's Organisation and Experience; compared it with the list of selected consulting and sponsored projects awarded to IIM Bangalore by Central Ministries/Departments/Statutory Body/Constitutional Body submitted by IIMs and found that only one detailed project report/research papers/impact assessments is eligible to be considered as an experience relevant to the scope of work.
- 6. Based on the technical proposal, technical Proposal Presentation and other requisite information/clarifications submitted by IIM Bangalore, the Committee found that the technical proposal was found to be complete and compliant with the terms and conditions of the RFP. Further, the Committee evaluated the technical proposal based on the evaluation criteria specified in the RFP and awarded the technical scores (marks) to IIM Bangalore as given below:
